Form Rules: Your creative writing piece must have / contain:

- 3 paragraphs
- Each paragraph must contain between 4-7 complete sentences
- 2 because clauses
- 2 dual adjectives
- 2 who / which clauses
- 2 adverbs
- The following words underlined in red: Winston Jr., Winston Sr., Terry Fox, Doug Alward (Terry's best friend), Police, Marathon of Hope, Frogger (old video game), Tragedy, Heroism, Basketball, Suspension (from school), Newspaper writer

Meaning Rules: Your creative writing piece must:

- be logical (make sense)
- have direction (a clear focus)
- be realistic
- be entertaining

Convention Rules: Your creative writing piece must:

- have few spelling mistakes
- have few grammar mistakes
- have few punctuation mistakes
- be legible

Style Rules: Your creative writing piece must:

• contain many dress-ups that are used correctly and make sense

Examples of Dress Ups

Because Clauses: I wrote a creative writing piece for Mr. Smith <u>because I</u> did not want to disappoint him.

Who/ Which Clauses: I wrote an exciting essay, <u>which was an assignment</u> for my teacher, about the heroic escapades of the amazing Terry Fox.

Dual Adjectives: The <u>crystal clear</u> HD television was a thing of beauty.

Adverbs: I ran <u>quickly</u> to the store to buy the last 50 inch HD television.
